Print off and fold down the middle.

If you bid a suit your partner will assume that you do not have 16HCP. Partner is likely to be weak and would probably pass a bid of 2♦. You have a fabulous suit to run and your double should score much better than making 2♦.</p>

Your shape is more 'no-trumpy' than the previous example but is less promising because you have no obvious source of extra tricks.</p>

You might sometimes get away with it but if partner as a very weak hand and West has 9-10 points then 1NT is likely to make, doubled!! And West might redouble. If East makes 1NT redoubled that would score 510 not vulnerable or 710 vulnerable!!</p>

You must respect partner's decision to double for penalties. Your side has at least 23 HCP and partner is sitting over a very vulnerable West. You should score well. The only time you should take out partner's penalty double is when you have a 5 card suit and are very weak (0-3/4 HCP)</p>

This is one of the few situations where you should take out partner's penalty double.</p>
