Print off and fold down the middle.

If you had 10-12 points you would jump to 2NT, and with 13+ points you could go straight to 3NT. Note that responses in No Trumps show the same point count ranges as when responding to an opening suit bid. The only difference is the requirement for a stopper.

With 5+ cards AND 3 honours in opener's suit your hand is good enough to leave the double in, converting it to a penalty double. Bear in mind that opener's hearts are sitting over you, which is why your hearts need to be good.
