Ogust 2NT Enquiry after partner's opening Weak 2 bid

After a weak two bid the OGUST convention allows for a detailed description of the opener's hand. It is invoked by the artificial 2NT bid made by the responder. The 2NT reply to a weak two bid shows strength (2+ card support and 15+ points* including shortage, and is inviting game. It asks whether the opener is weak (5-7/6-8 HCP) or strong (8- 10/9-11 HCP) and how many of the top three honours are held in the major. Responder will then decide the final contract, which may be in opener's suit or in 3NT or even a slam if responder has a very strong hand (19+ points.)

Opener responses:

- S → 3 = weak suit, weak HCP (6-8 HCP)
- > 3♦ = strong suit (2 of top 3 honours), weak HCP (6-8 HCP)
- > 3♥ = weak suit, strong HCP (9-10 HCP)
- > 3♠ = strong suit (2 of top 3 honours), strong HCP (9-10 HCP)
- ➢ 3NT = solid suit, AKQxxx or stronger

* Opener has 6-10 HCP, so 8-12 points including length. Opposite 8 HCP (10 points) a responder with 15 points has just about enough for game, especially if opener has a strong suit (AK+, KQ+ or AQ+). Responder should only count shortage points equal to the number of trump cards on his hand. So, with a void and two trumps he should only count 2 shortage points.
