1 West North East South ?	<ul><li>♣ J</li><li>♥ KJ9532</li><li>◆ KJ83</li><li>♣ 42</li></ul>	You have 9 HCP so are at the top end of the 5-10 HCP range for a Weak 2. Your heart suit is reasonable, SQT =8 and the shape is good (singleton and doubleton.
2 West North East South Pass Pass ?	<ul><li>♣ QJ9842</li><li>♥ 9</li><li>♦ K952</li><li>♣ 92</li></ul>	You have just 6 HCP, at the bottom end of the 5-10 range for a Weak 2, But you shape is good (6421) your suit is the master suit, spades. Partner and your right-hand opponent have both passed so West must have a big hand. After your pre-empt West will have to enter the bidding at the 3 level so may not find the best contract.
3 West North East South ?	<ul><li>♣ -</li><li>♥ 843</li><li>◆ KJ9652</li><li>♣ AQJ5</li></ul>	Your hand is too strong for a Weak 2 You satisfy the rule of 20 (scoring 21) and partner has not yet had a chance to bid Your side may have game values, even slam values, so you need to bid constructively to find the optimum contract
4 West North East South Pass Pass Pass ?	<ul><li>♣ J</li><li>♥ Q74</li><li>◆ QJ7632</li><li>♣ K96</li></ul>	Pass  After three passes it looks like everyone has around 10 points. If you open 2 ◆ the opponents may find a spade fit and make 2 ♠. Your shape is poor, so your best bet is to pass.
5 West North East South ?	<ul><li>♠ 8</li><li>♥ KJ6</li><li>◆ K976554</li><li>♣ Q4</li></ul>	Your SQOT isn't quite good enough for a Weak Three, but you have a SQOT of 8 so can open a Weak Two
6 West North East South 2 ♥ Dbl ?	<ul><li>♠ Q976</li><li>♥ 986</li><li>♦ K54</li><li>♣ J42</li></ul>	Extending the pre-empt. After the double West must bid if you pass, and they have plenty of bidding space to find a making contract. With a combined 9 hearts you bid to the level of the fit'. West will not know whether you have 0 points or 12+ points and will have to guess.
7 West North East South 2 ♥ Pass ?	<ul><li>♠ Q9765</li><li>♥ 98</li><li>♦ KJ4</li><li>♣ AQJ</li></ul>	Pass You have 13 HCP but must not be tempted to show your spades. Partner may have no spades. You have an 8 card heart fit. You are already at the level of the fit so must pass.
8 West North East South 2 ♥ Pass ?	<ul><li>★ K9876</li><li>♥ 98</li><li>◆ KQ9</li><li>♣ KQJ</li></ul>	Pass You have 14 HCP but it's a poor shape (no ruffing values), no aces, and five of your points are in queens and jacks (quacks) and unlikely to produce tricks.

10	West	North 2♥	<b>East</b> Pass	South ?	<ul><li>♠ A8763</li><li>♥ 98</li><li>♦ AK872</li><li>♣ A</li></ul>	You have a lovely 15 HCP, with four quick tricks, no 'quack', a fit and ruffing values. You can expect partner to make 6 tricks
11	West	North	East	South 2♥ ?	<ul><li>★ K875</li><li>♥ KQJ1076</li><li>◆ 92</li><li>♣ 2</li></ul>	Pass A very important rule: once you have pre- empted, you DO NOT BID AGAIN. Partner is now in charge.
12	West	North 2♥	<b>East</b> Pass	South ?	<ul><li>♠ K98</li><li>♥ Q1087</li><li>◆ A82</li><li>♣ 1083</li></ul>	<ul> <li>With 4333 shape (no ruffing potential), we should tend to raise only to one less than the level of the fit. A single raise might be sufficient to cause problems for the opponents</li> </ul>
