Answer: 4♣

Our \clubsuit KJx represents a good holding in partner's trial bid suit. Our fifth trump is adequate justification for bidding $4 \spadesuit$, despite our minimum high card values.

Answer: 3♣

Despite our respectable high card values, we decline partner's invitation with three losers in the trial bid suit.

Answer: 3♥

With no suitable trial bid, the best way to invite game is simply to re-raise to 3. Since we've failed to make a trial bid in a side suit with two or three losers, this inferentially suggests that our trumps are weak.

Answer: 3♦

With our invitational hand, we have a choice of two trial bids. We choose the cheaper suit, since it gives partner the chance to "pass the buck" by making a return trial bid if he can help in diamonds but wants to know if you can help in hearts.

Answer: 4♠

With a good five loser hand we should just bid game in our agreed suit. Unless partner's strength is mainly in clubs, $4 \triangleq$ is likely to have reasonable play. Factors that encourage us to bid game include our good intermediate cards ($\triangleq 10$, \forall J and $\bullet 10$) and having more aces than queens.

Answer: Pass

It's true that this is a six loser hand, but we have no "fillers" in any suit. With only 13 points and no singleton we're not good enough to make a game invitation.

Answer: 4♥

Our Kx represents very good help for partner.

Answer: 3♦

Without the takeout double we might have taken a shot at game, but here we should allow for the possibility that partner has stretched for his response. We should therefore make a trial bid instead
