(finding a 5-3 fit in a major)

When **opener** has a 15+ balanced hand which includes a 5-card major, she will open in her major and rebid No Trumps. If partner has three cards in opener's major, partner can give delayed 3-card support with her rebid, so the 8-card fit will not be missed. For example:

However, if it is **opener's partner** who has the 5-card major, an 8-card fit in a major may well remain undiscovered, and an inferior (possibly failing) NT contract will often be reached. Note that responder's rebid of her major would guarantee a 6+ card suit.

Even on a hand where 3NT will also make, with 25-26 HCP and an 8 card major fit, 3NT makes 65% of the time and game in a major makes 80% of the time, so it is generally better to play in the major unless you consciously decide No Trumps is a better bet. Checkback Stayman is designed to make sure you will not miss game with an 8 card major fit.

After 1 any − 1 major − 1NT, if responder bids 2 (Checkback) she is asking: "I have 5 cards in my major. Have you got three card support for my major?

Note: Checkback Stayman is only used with **invitational or better** hands – i.e. 8+ HCP, because if a fit in the major is not found responder may have to sign off in 2NT or higher. (*This is entirely consistent with the 11 HCP minimum requirement for Stayman after partner's opening weak 1NT, which has a range that is three HCP lower than the 15-17 HCP range for a 1NT rebid). With a weaker hand responder should pass or rebid a 5- card suit rather than use Checkback.*

Opener's Rebids

- \triangleright 2♥/2♠ shows a minimum affirmative (15 or a poor 16 HCP).
- \triangleright 3♥/3♠ shows a maximum affirmative (17 or a good 16 HCP)
- ➤ 2 shows a minimum denial no 3-card support
- ➤ 2NT shows a maximum denial no 3-card support.
